





SOCIO-ECONOMIC SURVEY AND AWARENESS PROGRAM ON SANITATION ON 11.03.2024



On Saturday, March 16, 2024, the second-semester students of Centre for Studies in Geography, Dibrugarh University embarked on a socio-economic survey and awareness program on sanitation. Divided into two groups, they visited two villages, Borpathar and Dighola Gaon, with the objective of assessing the hygienic conditions prevalent in these communities.
